to begin. And by growth, I mean not only growth in numbers. While, of course, we expect more Jews to take advantage of our additional space and new beautiful classrooms, we will also need to grow in program offerings and in the depth of content we will provide to the Jewish community we look to serve.

I'm glad to announce that some of this growth has already begun. Congregation Kol Shalom is pleased to announce that Allison Charapp, one of our veteran DRRS teachers, has become the director of the soon to open "Tree of Life Pre-School at Kol Shalom." We wish her much success and look forward to our synagogue becoming populated with boys and girls ready to receive a Jewish education at the earliest age possible.

Last summer, we realized that in addition to building a physical structure to house our youth, we needed also to extend the programming available for our Jewish teenagers and preteens. Therefore, with Janet Clarke as our Youth Committee chair, we have successfully launched a Kol Shalom USY (United Synagogue Youth) chapter for high school students, and a Kadimah chapter for students in middle school. Marin Weisblatt, another of our DRRS teachers, is serving as the youth advisor to both of these groups. Many fun activities have been planned and more are to come.

Both of these youth groups provide our youngsters with the opportunity to meet other Jewish boys and girls not only in Anne Arundel County but also throughout Maryland, Virginia and even into North Carolina. If your child or grandchild could possibly attend not only the events in the synagogue, but also some of the conventions or the summer encampment, it will likely be a most memorable and worthwhile experience. Please watch for the information the synagogue will provide on upcoming USY and Kadimah events.

Finally, it is not too late to begin planning your child's summer activities. Studies have shown that Jewish education, youth groups, Jewish camps and trips to Israel help youth and adults form a strong Jewish Identity. USY continues to provide all of these opportunities and the summer is an excellent time for your child to continue to experience Jewish life with his or her peers.


